AAA Annual Call for papers – for ASA Members and Affiliates



The call for paper submissions is now available on the AAA website. As ASA members, the opportunities are the following:

Executive Session submissions are open from Feb. 8 – March 6th. These sessions can be either oral paper presentation sessions or round tables. Priority will be given to the proposals that have:

- demonstrated a commitment to equity and inclusion and/or a clear analysis of power (i.e. anti-imperialist, anti-white supremacist, decolonial, anti-ableist, feminist, anti-transphobic, anti-xenophobic, etc.)
- b. Include a statement about how the submission has incorporated the goals of equity, diversity of session participants, such as organizational/institutional affiliation, career stage, race, ethnicity, disability, sexuality, class, religion, national identity, and gender.

Anyone considering proposing or organizing an Executive or another session can contact Program Chair Jean Schensul (Jean.schensul@icrweb.org) and/or program Co-Chair Rick Feinberg (katoakitematangi@gmail.com) as soon as possible and we can assist you if necessary. The accept/decline notifications will be sent the week of March 25. If you submit an Executive session and it is not accepted you can resubmit it as a general submission. Other submission types with later deadlines are as follows.

Group Submission Types

Oral Presentation Session.

This session type is 90 minutes long, and includes 4-6 presenters. Your submission must include a title and abstract for the entire session, as well as a title, abstract and name of the presenter for each individual presentation. Each participant presents their work one-by-one in a series of 15-minute presentations. Participants may read a prepared speech or informally discuss their work using visual aids such as a PowerPoint presentation. Sessions are in person only. You can submit an Executive Session, a General Session or a Late Breaking Session. Roles associated with Oral Presentation sessions are:

- Organizer (1 min, 2 max)
- Chair (1 min/max)
- Presenters (4 min, 6 max)

Roundtable/Town Hall Session

This session is 90 minutes long and designed to allow participants to discuss and share ideas with each other on a topic of shared interest with the aid of a discussant. In this session type, the discussant acts as a guide and frames the conversation, with most of the comments and discussion coming from participants. This session type includes 4-7 participants and only a session title and abstract, no individual talk titles or abstracts. Roundtables can be in person or virtual. They can be submitted as Executive Session, General Session, or Late Breaking session. Roles include:

- Organizer (1 min, 2 max)
- Discussant (1 min, 2 max)
- Presenters (4-7)

NEW NEW New Conversation or Debate

2-4 Participants engage in a traditional-style debate led by one to two moderators (discussant role) and followed by a brief question and answer

session from audience members. <u>In person or virtual live.</u> They can be submitted as a General Submission or late breaking submission. Roles in Conversation or Debate sessions are:

- Organizer (1 min, 2 max)
- Discussant (serve as moderator) (1 min, 2 max)
- Presenters (2-4)

NEW NEW NEW Interview

One-on-one conversation in which a host interviews one person about a topic in an engaging lively discussion followed by a question-and-answer session with audience members. In person or virtual live. General call or Late Breaking Session. Roles associated with Interview sessions are;

- Organizer (1 min, 2 max)
- Presenters (serve as host and interviewee) (2-4)

Individual Submissions

Flash Presentation Session

"A rapid-fire, engaging performance of current projects/concepts via a few image-rich slides, along with brief visual descriptions, and dynamic and reasonably-paced spoken content. Flash presentations will be combined into session blocks made up of 6 – 8 flash presenters who will present on a variety of topics in each session. Each flash presentation should be no longer than 6 minutes." These sessions are in-person. Flash presentations can be submitted under:

- General Call for Participation
- · Late-Breaking Call for Participation
